Major John. H. Lucky Luckadoo May Presentation

On May 7, 2024, at the Dallas Chapter luncheon Air Force Companion attendees and guests in the aviation industry were kept in rapt attention by the presentation of Maj. John H. "Lucky' Luckadoo USAF (Ret). At 102 years young, Maj Luckadoo is the sole surviving member of his forty-man twin-engine flight school class in February 1943. Luckadoo described his B-17 bomber and related what is what like bombing in formations that could have averaged as many as 1000 planes. He related the challenges of going on raids with the 100th Bomb Group with and without fighter escort. Only four members of his 40-man class survived their tour of 25 combat missions. As a member of an early U.S. Bomber Group sent to England, the losses in his unit quickly named his unit "The Bloody Hundredth." Attendees will never forget this talk by a member of "The Greatest Generation." Although not his birthday, the Chapter ordered a birthday cake for him.

NATIONAL SECURITY REPORT

TIKTOK IS A US NATIONAL SECURITY DILEMMA

The US is one of several countries which have grave concerns over the Chinese run TikTok social media platform. It is the fastest growing and most used social media platform by youth in America. TikTok uses algorithms designed to influence youth and seeks to diminish the youth population of drive, optimism, and culture. Its thoughtful and complex algorithms are vetted by the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) through a Chinese internet technology company named ByteDance. In his book, <u>Blood Money</u>, Peter Schweizer, states TikTok's algorithms are a CCP military state secret. The Chinese are using TikTok, movies, and video games to wage psychological warfare against the US, Europe, Asia, and other Western countries. The CCP is trying to create positive emotions toward China and negative sentiments for the US and the West. In China, the equivalent of TikTok is Douyin. Douyin is scholastic, aspirational, and useful, while the US and Western version, TikTok, has altered standards. In the US and the West, TikTok content is primarily non-academic, exploitative, and often demeaning.

TikTok algorithms gather information from each of its downloaded applications. According to Schweizer's book, within 10 seconds of logging onto TikTok, the CCP has collected the equivalent of 125 typed pages of a person's individual data, contents, contacts, history, photos, voice print, and other information it drained from a user's computer or mobile phone. This collection of data on US citizens is a national security threat. TikTok's primary audience are Generation Z or Zoomers (the generation born between 1997 and 2012). A typical US user spends 82 minutes each day on the TikTok platform, two times the time spent on Facebook and Instagram, and three times more time than they spend on Snapchat, or Twitter. Douyin has limited daily and weekly usage in China because of its addictive characteristics. TikTok exceeded two billion mobile downloads worldwide in 2020 and passed Google in 2021 as the most popular Internet website. TikTok's popularity has been aided by Hollywood celebrities and even NFL endorsements. Its combination of music videos, stupid antics of high school and college students, and animal videos has helped to give TikTok a worldwide appeal to generation Z.

The CCP and Chinese military are aware of TikTok's addictive nature of its propaganda, and the Chinese have been well-received by American and Western youth. ByteDance is in Beijing near the enormous headquarters of the China's Ministry of State Security and is also a cofounder of the Beijing Academy of Artificial Intelligence along with the top universities of China. ByteDance is not just an entertainment platform, it is a CCP backed company integral to the military intelligence of Communist China. The Chinese TikTok algorithm pushes highly addictive content that is very personalized. Each feed is individualized to effectively seduce the user into watching their content. TikTok then chooses your friends or followers for you, rather than having the user select them.

Australia, Singapore, US, and other Western countries have banned TikTok since they believe TikTok is a national security threat because of its user data collection. In addition to being very addictive, having data privacy violations, unsuitable content, TikTok spreads false information, and undermines US policies. Several countries have banned or tried to limit TikTok with fines to protect their young adults. This type of propaganda is psychological warfare and is part of China's Unrestricted Warfare against the US and the West. The CCP controls the political content of TikTok and restricts any information critical of China. *TikTok uses the same source code used to monitor the Chinese population and is an ideal platform to distribute propaganda. China even believes it can influence US elections using social media. TikTok should not be able to conduct business in the US if it remains under CCP control.*
