NATIONAL & HOMELAND SECURITY REPORT

HOW THE DEPARTMENT OF GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY MAY HELP NATIONAL SECURITY AND AMERICA'S FUTURE

A new initiative by the incoming Trump administration is creating the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) and will be led by billionaire businessmen - Elon Musk and Vivek Ramaswamy. The goals of DOGE are to cut waste, fraud, inefficiency, and lack of effectiveness from the US government. The US ended the Fiscal Year 2024 with a \$1.8Trillion (T) budget deficit, \$36T in national debt, and interest on the debt of \$1T. These numbers are the highest in the history of our country. DOGE is tasked with cutting some of the 2+ million federal workers, regulations, and some of the \$6.5T of government spending to include eliminating whole departments. These federal organizations could be on the chopping block – the Department of Education, Department of Interior, FAA, IRS, FBI, USPS, and the EPA. President-elect Trump has said he would like DOGE to help the US have smaller government with more efficiency and less bureaucracy, while Musk has said he would like to cut \$2T from the federal budget. Recently, the Pentagon failed its seventh consecutive annual audit and could not account for portions of its \$824 billion budget. DOGE proponents argue the Supreme Court has recently returned some of the power government agencies have acquired to regulate policies, back to Congress.

Critics of DOGE are alarmed with its aim to cut government budgets, policies, and personnel. They oppose the idea of any reduction to the administrative state and may wage a vigorous opposition. DOGE will likely face legal and political opposition from government employees, teacher unions, and political opponents to smaller government. Some have suggested air, water, safety, and other standards could be reduced. Other interest groups will oppose racial, CRT, DEI, gender identity and confusion issues, anti- Jewish, or anti-Christian values, and other radical issues which were rejected by the majority of the electorate in the landslide national election. Still others point to a potential regulatory conflict of interest with several of Musk's companies.

The future of US national security depends upon the US developing a growing economy based upon meritocracy, not woke, artificial, harmful policies based on race. Diversity of ideas is much more important than diversity of skin color or ethnicity. Discrimination should never be tolerated. However, discrimination called affirmative action, or policies based on sex, skin color, or religion continue and highlight it with the imposed artificial barriers of quotas, or having biological men compete in women sports. These radical ideas were soundly defeated by the Trump landslide electoral victory and winning majorities in the House and Senate. US government leaders must become fiduciaries and better stewards of the country's budgets and expenditures. Wasteful government spending and woke policies were punished at the ballot boxes and with companies like Target, Anheuser-Bush, and Blackrock. If the nation's debt is not drastically cut, the interest on the debt will force more money to be spent servicing the debt instead of providing government services. Reducing the tax burden and simplifying the tax code will help all Americans. Having a more efficient and effective government will benefit all US citizens. Reducing bureaucracy will improve education, help end political correctness, return merit to secondary schools and universities, and restore value to US diplomas and degrees. DOGE may have a lasting impact on US national security if it is able to decrease the massive mismanagement of the nation's treasure which has existed for decades by reducing waste, fraud, inefficiency, and inept government.


